Republic Day to feature Bangla armed forces band

India to display key military assets in parade

New Delhi, Jan. 24: India will be displaying some of its key military assets, such as T-90 tanks and BrahMos missile system, during the 72nd Republic Day celebrations on Rajpath, with a marching-cum-band contingent of the Bangladesh armed forces all set to take part in the ceremonial parade for the first time.

The leader of the 122-member contingent on Saturday thanked India for the gesture and said, the "enduring relationship" between the two countries is growing day by day.

The Bangladeshi contingent, with members drawn from all the three wings of its armed forces, will be the first marching contingent to walk down the ceremonial boulevard on January 26.

India's military might

and some of the state-of-the-art assets of the armed forces, including three T-90 tanks, BrahMos missile system, BMP-II, two Pinaka multiple launch rocket system, two bridge laying tanks, electronic warfare equipment Samvay and one upgraded Shikha air defence weapon system, will be showcased during the parade on Rajpath, which will be held following COVID-19 safety guidelines.

"This year, no new asset will be displayed, but upgraded versions of various key assets and equipment will be there," Chief of Staff, Delhi Area, Maj Gen Alok Kacker, told reporters.

He said 18 marching contingents - 16 marching and two animal-mounted - will take part in the parade from the armed forces, paramilitary forces,

Delhi Police, National Cadet Corps and National Service Scheme, along with bands, including 15 from the military.

The 61 Cavalry, consisting of 43 horses, will be marching down the Rajpath as part of the mounted column.

Due to COVID-19 safety norms, there will be no motorcycle display this time, a major attraction for the crowd at Republic Day celebrations on the Rajpath, and also the veterans marching contingent will also not be there, Kacker said.

The contingents in the parade will stop at the National Stadium this year instead of following the regular route all the way to the Red Fort, primarily due to COVID-19 safety norms, Kacker added. He said COVID-19 safety norms have been followed from

day one and contingents have moved from "bubble to bubble" to minimise all scope of infection. A full dress-rehearsal of the parade was held on Saturday morning.

Capt Preeti Choudhary from 140 AD Regt (SP) will be commanding the upgraded Shikha weapon system as part of the mechanised column on Rajpath, officials said. The newly inducted Rafale fighter aircraft will feature in India's Republic Day parade on January 26 and culminate the flypast by carrying out the 'Vertical Charlie' formation. The parade will include 32 tableaux - 17 of various states and UTs, nine of ministries and six from defence arm, including of IAF, Navy, Indian Naval Coast Guard, two from the DRDO and one from BRO (Border Roads Organisation).

The US Census Bureau is suspending efforts to create neighbourhood-level statistics on the citizenship and age of residents, using 2020 census data, in the latest rollback of Trump administration census-related initiatives that critics feared would be used to favour Republicans and whites during the drawing of state and local districts.

As part of an order President Joe Biden signed Wednesday on the 2020 census, the Census Bureau said on Friday that it would discontinue efforts to create citizenship tabulations at the city-block level using 2020 census data combined with administrative records.

Among his first acts as President, Biden's order revoked two Trump directives related to the 2020 census. The first attempted to discern the citizenship status of every US resident through administrative records, and the second sought to exclude people in the US illegally from the numbers used for apportioning congressional seats among the states.

India records 14,849 fresh COVID cases

New Delhi, Jan. 24: India's COVID-19 caseload has gone up to 1,06,54,333 with 14,849 people testing positive for the coronavirus infection in a day, while the number of recoveries has surged to 1,03,16,786, according to the health ministry. The death toll due to the viral disease has climbed to 1,53,339 with 155 more fatalities, the ministry's data updated at 8 a.m., showed.

The number of people who have recuperated from the disease has surged to 1,03,16,786, pushing the national COVID-19 recovery rate to 96.83 per cent, while the case fatality rate stands at 1.44 per cent.

Carson, Jan. 24:

One of the keys to President Joe Biden's \$2 trillion clean energy plan could be a mineral that lies in a salt flat above a prehistoric volcano just south of the Oregon-Nevada line.

But the question of how to extract lithium and whether former President Donald Trump's Department of Interior rushed a mine through the approval process could be an early test for Biden and his nominee for Interior Secretary, New Mexico

Representative Deb Haaland.

The US Bureau of Land Management issued a record of decision on Trump's final Friday in office for an open-pit lithium mine at Thacker Pass, which is roughly 53 miles (85 kilometers) north of Winnemucca, Nevada.

Lithium Americas, the company behind the mine, believes it can supply a quantity "critical for establishing a strong domestic lithium supply chain required to support a low-

carbon economy, its President and CEO Jon Evans said in a statement.

Lithium, long used for rechargeable batteries found in cellphones and laptops, is expected to become an increasingly valuable commodity if the new administration pushes earmarks to scale up electric vehicle production.

But its extraction has splintered environmentalists. While technologists are eager to use it to transition away from

carbon-based fuels, conservationists worry about the impact new mines have on endangered species and the environment.

The approval of the mine is among several eleventh-hour decisions issued by Trump's Department of Interior to advance energy and mining projects, including a West Virginia oil pipeline and an Arizona copper mine on land the San Carlos Apache Tribe considers sacred. Unlike those decisions, which could be reversed, Thacker Pass procured the final federal permit needed to begin construction one difficult to overturn.

We are not going to fix the climate if we don't do it right, John Hadder, the executive director of Great Basin Resource Watch, said of the approval. There's nothing "green" about sloppy permitting. Hadder said he worries efforts to usher in a green revolution overshadow the need to adhere to established environmental review processes required under federal law.

25,000 tractors to take part in Jan. 26 'kisan parade'

Ghaziabad, Jan. 24: Around 25,000 tractors from Uttar Pradesh and Uttarakhand will participate in the 'kisan parade' in the national capital on January 26, Bharatiya Kisan Union (BKU) leader Rakesh Tikait said on Saturday.

Farmers moving towards UP Gate from

the two states on their tractor trolleys were intercepted by police in different districts but farmers will arrive here at every cost, he said.

"Around 25,000 tractors would arrive here and a tractor rally would be brought out on Republic Day. Apart from the districts of western Uttar Pradesh,

farmers would take out rallies in every district," Tikait said in a statement.

"No political person will be allowed to participate," the BKU national spokesperson said. District administrations are sending notices to farmers and mounting pressure on them not to

participate in the rallies citing COVID-19 norms and section 144 of the CrPc, he claimed.

Routes of the rally will be decided by the police of Uttar Pradesh, Delhi and Haryana and details will be released by the Sanyukt Kisan Morcha after a final decision, Tikait said.

Farmers leader Abhinav Kohar, after attending a meeting between unions protesting the new agricultural laws and senior police officers on Saturday, claimed that the Delhi Police had given permission to the farmers' tractor parade on January 26. However, Delhi Police additional public relations officer Anil Mittal said, "We are in the final stages of talks with farmers."

The tractor parade will start from the Ghaziabad, Singhu and Tikri border points of Delhi, but the final details of routes are yet to be finalised, said Kohar, who is a senior member of the Sanyukt Kisan Morcha, an umbrella body of the agitating unions.

The active COVID-19 caseload of the country remained below two lakh for the fifth consecutive day. There are 1,84,408 active cases of the coronavirus infection in the country currently, which account for 1.73 per cent of its total caseload, the data stated. According to the Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR), a total of 19,17,66,871 samples have so far been tested in the country for the viral disease, including 7,81,752 on Saturday.

Of the 155 fatalities, 56 were reported from Maharashtra, 23 from Kerala and 10 each from Delhi, Punjab and West Bengal.

Failing heart: Lalu shifted to AIIMS Delhi, says son

Delhi/ Ranchi, Jan. 24: Jailed RJD chief Lalu Prasad was admitted to AIIMS-Delhi on Saturday night after his health condition deteriorated while undergoing treatment at a hospital in Ranchi, officials said.

"He has been admitted in the coronary care unit (CCU) of the cardiothoracic centre of the AIIMS," an official in Delhi said.

A team of doctors has been constituted to evaluate and monitor the former Bihar chief minister's condition and he has been admitted under Dr. Rakesh Yadav, professor of Cardiology at

AIIMS.

Lalu Prasad (72), convicted in fodder scam cases, was undergoing treatment at the Rajendra Institute of Medical Sciences (RIMS) in the Jharkhand capital for multiple ailments.

"Lalu Prasad was having trouble breathing for the last two days. On Friday, he was found to be having pneumonia. Considering his age, we decided to shift him to AIIMS-Delhi on the advice of doctors for better treatment," RIMS Director Dr. Kameshwar Prasad had earlier said.

On Friday, Lalu Prasad's wife Rabi Devi,

daughter Misa Bharti, sons Tej Pratap and Tejaswini reached Ranchi on a special plane after being informed of the veteran leader's deteriorating health. The family met Prasad in the night.

After meeting his father, Tejashwi told reporters that his condition was worrisome. Tejashwi also met Chief Minister Hemant Soren at his residence during the day to seek cooperation of the state government in arranging to take his father to Delhi.

Mamata mulls 4 capitals, rotational Parliament sessions

Kolkata, Jan. 24: West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee on Saturday said India should have four capitals on a rotational basis and sessions of the Parliament should be held in different locations in the country. She also slammed the Centre for its decision to observe January 23 as 'Parakram Diwas' to commemorate the birth anniversary of Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose and said the Narendra Modi government did not consult with her before announcing it.

"During the British era, Kolkata was the capital of the country. I think we must have four capitals on a rotational basis. Why does the country have only one capital? And the sessions of Parliament should be held in different places in the country," she said, while addressing a gathering after leading a grand procession to

pay tribute to Netaji on his 125th birth anniversary.

She led the over seven-km procession from Shyambazar in north Kolkata to Mayo Road in the heart of the city after paying tribute to a statue of the freedom fighter and blowing a conch shell when a siren was sounded at 12.15 p.m., the time when Bose was born on this day in 1897.

"We are not parochial. We are speaking for everyone. In south India, one (capital) can either be in Tamil Nadu, Andhra Pradesh, Karnataka or Kerala. In north India, one can be in Uttar Pradesh, Punjab, Rajasthan or Madhya Pradesh.

"Why cannot there be one in Bihar, Odisha or West Bengal? There can be one in the Northeast. We have to change our outlook. One leader, one ration card, one political

party for one nation... What is the valuation? We want united India," Banerjee said.

Banerjee questioned as to why Bose's birth anniversary cannot be celebrated as 'Deshnayak Diwas'. "They may dislike me politically but could have consulted with me. They could have consulted with Netaji's great-grandsons Sugata Bose or Sumantra Bose on choosing a name.

"Who has given the name 'Parakram'? We in West Bengal are celebrating the day as 'Deshnayak Diwas' because it has a history. Rabindranath Tagore had described Netaji as 'Deshnayak'. That is why we have used the name to link the two legends of Bengal," she said.

"We do not celebrate Netaji's birthday only in the years when elections are scheduled. We celebrate his birthday every year. And because this is his
